HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENT

This is an important document that sets out what we all need to happen throughout your child's time at St Andrew's. Please take time to read it carefully before you sign it.

The School will:

- Endeavour to ensure your child achieves his or her full potential as a valued member of the school community
- Provide a balanced curriculum which caters for individual needs and differences
- Care for your child's safety and happiness
- Listen, treat everyone fairly, consistently and show them respect
- Provide your child with good role models
- Encourage your child to take responsibility for their own belongings
- Contact parents if there is a problem with attendance and punctuality
- Work in partnership with parents
- Resolve conflict and discuss impact of actions on others
- Make parents aware of any concerns or problems that affect their child's work or behaviour
- Arrange parents' evenings during which progress will be discussed
- Keep parents informed about school activities through the website, regular letters, texts, newsletters and notices about special events
- Expect that a junior child (Y3-6) will make their own way home unless alternative arrangements are made with the class teacher

The Parents will:

- Support decisions made by staff and work in partnership with school
- Respect the views of others and encourage their child to do the same
- Be a positive role model
- Ensure that their child is provided with everything that they need for a positive day (attending school regularly and on time, regular meals and bedtime routine, provide correct school uniform and PE kit, label clothing, support homework and reading opportunities at home)
- Provide a note of explanation or telephone school if their child is absent
- Ensure that contact details and medical details are kept up to date
- Let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect their child's work or behaviour
- Support the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour
- Attend parents' evening and discussions about their child's progress
- Get to know about their child's life at school
- Inform school if there is a change to the person collecting their child
- Ensure that their child is collected on time

The Pupil will:

- Respect appropriate boundaries and rules for good behaviour in the school and community
- Respect equipment, people and property in the school and community
- Take responsibility for their own actions and belongings (with support in the Foundation Stage)
- Be a good friend, treating others as they would want to be treated
- Try their best in everything
